## HOUSING & PUBLIC SPACE +


URBinLAB's research on housing and public space recognizes their vital interconnectedness as essential components of a qualified, accessible, and dignified urban habitat.

Housing, being the cornerstone of the built environment, reflects the interplay between social dynamics and domestic practices. Public space, on the other hand, serves as the communal ground where diverse urban and territorial systems converge, supporting societal activities and ecological networks that embed cities in a broader biophysical context.

On-going research at URBinLAB revolves around addressing pressing challenges concerning affordable and accessible housing, closely aligned with current urban policies. It searches for innovative practices to activate public space and social spaces through temporary, emergent, and intermittent configurations while exploring potential approaches to strategically design public space as a multi-system and trans-scalar network at the metropolitan level.

**Climate change adaptation** strategies are seen as transversal challenge that is being addressed by URBinLAB team, namely through designed solutions that integrates water as a fundamental component of public space, but also on the **transformation of waterfronts and estuarine urbanization** transformation in response to rising sea levels as a key area of research.

Another significant field is the **food and urban agriculture nexus**, exploring circularity and proximity in urbanized territories. This field is being approached in its relationship with **new land-use patterns and forms of urban integration**, as well as a tool to combine **ecosystem services with the protection of valuable landscape resources**. Furthermore, the research line collaborates with the Lisbon's School of Agronomy Landscape Architecture program and partners with international entities, fostering strong relationships and disciplinary and pedagogical connections within urbanism and architecture, namely through the initiative of several design studios and workshops.




**LANDSCAPE &  
CLIMATE CHANGE +**

As a fundamental dimension of contemporary urban life, mobility encompasses multiple challenges, including the transition to low-carbon energy and the promotion of alternative solutions to private cars. Additionally, it addresses socio-economic disparities arising from the spatial distribution of transportation and mobility services.

URBinLAB's research on urban mobility focuses mainly on **three key areas**: 1) **investigating the socio-economic disparities of Mobility as a Service (MaaS) solutions**; 2) **developing bike networks and creating conditions for walkable urban spaces** to contribute to healthier cities; and, 3) **understanding the interplay between land-use distribution and its impact on mobility patterns**, particularly in metropolitan areas.


Furthermore, the line of urban mobility collaborates with the architectural and urban design perspective, leveraging Lisbon School of Architecture's advanced training in urbanism to explore future mobility scenarios. By integrating these perspectives, URBinLAB aims to offer innovative insights and strategies to tackle the complex challenges of urban mobility in contemporary cities at the metropolitan level.



**URBAN MOBILITY +**

As cities and territories confront **significant changes in the planning and management of urban transformation** under new economic conditions, actor constellations, and multiscalar interplays, **this research line delves into emerging and innovative processes to address more flexible, adaptive, and responsive multilevel policy frameworks and planning tools.**


This approach bridges spatial, design-oriented, and morphological interpretation of complex urban and territorial conditions with recent trends towards place-based approaches, soft planning processes and out-of-the box urban initiatives. URBinLAB members are actively engaged in **applied research related to urban and territorial planning**, forging close partnerships with Portuguese Municipalities, regional and central administration agencies, and international academic networks. Notably, they are involved in developing the first generation of Municipal Spatial Plans for Timor-Leste, reflecting the group's global scope and commitment to advancing urban and territorial planning beyond established boundaries.

## Collaborative Urban Laboratory for Land Use Monitoring, Planning and Sustainable Development


The project's main goal is to establish an Urban Collaborative Lab prototype (LUCO) based on geodata, technology, and institutional cooperation. It aims to support sustainable urban planning, climate change awareness, risk reduction, empowerment through knowledge, and training. The Lab will operate an Urban Land Use Observatory to monitor land use changes, fostering scientific and technical capacity in Maputo as a framework for other African urban areas.

The Lab focuses on five key issues: monitoring land use changes, assessing urban expansions' impact, promoting geodata and technology use, providing easy access infrastructure for research and training, and involving students in data surveys and analysis.

By emphasizing the importance of geoinformation for sustainable urban development, the project aims to provide insights through data collection and analysis in Maputo. It will build on previous research (<https://zenodo.org/record/8089260>) to create a geoinfrastructure and analytical tools for institutions and researchers, and ultimately to support more just and resilient cities.

The project's methodology involves data collection through satellite, UAV imagery, and surveys, engaging partner institutions for data sharing, identifying indicators, and designing a collaborative platform. Immediate results include a technological and collaborative infrastructure prototype, thematic maps on urban development, stakeholder engagement and empowerment, and support for knowledge and capacity building.

The project aspires to implement its methodology in other African cities.


**I**ntermittent City: Temporary Uses and Sharing Practices to support an Adaptive Urban Space focuses on the conceptualization of the catalytic **role of temporary uses and sharing practices in the urban transformations of the contemporary city.**

Along with the political, socio-economic and technological changes that emerged in the new millennium, cities have been under significant changes. Values of temporariness and sharing have appeared in different dimensions of the public life, driving urban transformations and disrupting conventional relations between space, time, and use: different expression of housing (co-living, temporary accommodation); new forms of working (co-working, homeworking); shared mobility (bike-sharing, car-sharing); sharing of goods (creative commerce, collaborative consumption, community food) and services (Netflix, Spotify), both physically or through digital platforms; spontaneous cultural events; unexpected uses in anonymous spaces (parties in abandoned structures; terraces in parking spaces; urban agriculture in vacant lots), etc.

The set of urban dynamics that have in common temporariness and sharing are referred to as **Intermittent Practices (IP)**.

Based on various case studies and operational initiatives, *Intermittent City aims to propose design tools and methods that drive urban changes through Intermittent Practices* - as catalysts for these changes and as a resource - **encouraging an adaptive city.**

To explore this argument, **the project considers IP in the Municipality of Lisbon** in order to: **1**) identify and systematize their characteristics and foundations (SWITCH ON), **2**) analyze and evaluate their structural components and impacts (CONNECT), and **3**) contribute to a design-oriented perspective for future urban transformations (LIGHT UP).



**M**etroPublicNet aims at exploring the experience of public space qualification projects in Lisbon Metropolitan Area (LMA) since 1998. While offering a critical insight into their rationale, aims and results, we are looking for the potential foundation of a future Metropolitan Public Space Network (MPSN).



The **starting question** of this research is **whether public space should be conceived and shaped at the metropolitan scale**, in order to provide an integrated and coherent network, capable of efficiently responding to the challenges of urban robustness, low-carbon mobility and territorial cohesion.

To address this question, the project explores the **hypothesis** that a MPSN, if **conceptualized, planned and designed at a metropolitan scale, can maximize territorial synergies and integration**. To explore this argument, MetroPublicNet looks into recent public space improvement projects in LMA as a **research object** to: **1)** identify and systematize its features and rationales, **2)** analyse and assess its structural components and impacts, and **3)** contribute with a design-oriented perspective on the shaping of a future MPSN.



Mapping of Public Space interventions in the LMA between 1998 and 2023



## Mobility as a Service and Socio-Territorial Inequalities




It is well known that **transportation can be a major cause of socio-territorial inequalities (STIs)**.

Recently, several new **shared mobility services** have appeared as new transportation options. If properly integrated with public transport (PT), these can constitute an alternative to car ownership and use by offering multimodal mobility access instead of ownership, i.e. offering **Mobility-as-a-Service (MaaS)**. However, the role and impact of MaaS are yet to be determined and fully understood. MASTI will specifically deal with the **relationship between MaaS and STIs**, answering **2 research questions:** **1)** Is MaaS contributing to a reduction or an increase in existing STIs? **2)** Can MaaS contribute to a reduction of STIs and support more sustainable travel patterns? **Lisbon's metropolitan area will be our case study, following a mixed-methods approach** to evaluate the fairness of a situation (without MaaS) and of the intervention (with MaaS), according to **four local variables**: resources, opportunities, outcomes and well-being.


The SOFTPLAN research project investigates soft planning practices in Portugal, with a focus on two key aspects: (i) the influence of the European Union's Cohesion Policy and Structural Investment Funds in promoting soft planning approaches, and (ii) the interaction of soft planning practices with the national territorial planning system and its statutory instruments.

Soft planning refers to non-statutory and non-binding processes aimed at strategically developing specific territories and regions. These processes operate outside and alongside the formal procedures established in the current territorial administration, and are characterized by a voluntary nature. By emphasizing effective policy implementation in challenging and complex contexts (socially, economically, politically, administratively, etc.), soft planning adopts multidimensional approaches that necessitate integrating and coordinating various sectoral policies horizontally, coordinating different levels of government vertically, and engaging relevant stakeholders and territorial actors pivotal to the development of the target area.

The research highlights how the European Commission, through the European Structural Funds and Community Support Frameworks, has introduced non-binding policy instruments to promote integrated territorial approaches. This stimulated the emergence of soft planning processes alongside traditional spatial planning and territorial management instruments.

To explore the impact of EU Policy Initiatives on fostering soft planning practices in Portugal, the SOFTPLAN project examines place-based territorial approaches outlined in Portugal 2020, the EU-Portugal Partnership Agreement for 2014-2020, with a particular focus on the Metropolitan Area of Lisbon.

By delving into the intricacies of soft planning within the Portuguese context, the SOFTPLAN project aims to enhance our understanding of how these approaches are influenced by EU policies and how they interact with existing territorial planning practices.

The MetroGov3c - Research Project - Governance in the Lisbon Metropolitan Area in a context of conflict, competition and cooperation results from the **conviction that there is a need to rethink the structures and processes of territorial coordination of strategies and policies for the Lisbon Metropolitan Area (LMA)**. As has been evident, it is urgent to deepen research in this area due to the failure of multiple projects already formulated before, the formation of new constellations of actors and the emergence of new societal challenges (aging, climate change, e-government, economic crisis, among others).

A new **science-based** approach is therefore considered essential for formalizing adequate **responses to the new political-institutional and economic-financial contexts in Portugal**.

The project is structured according to **6 main objectives/TASKS**, organized according to the **three temporal dimensions**: past, present and future.

**Task 1:** Bibliographic Review;

**Task 2:** Assessment of governance models in LMA;

**Task 3:** Survey and evaluation of metropolitan governance models in southern Europe;





Matriz Global de Indicadores





Timor-Leste's spatial planning practice is relatively new, with the first approved spatial plan introduced in 2015 for the island of Ataúro. In 2017, a framework act established spatial planning as a public policy, laying the legal foundations for land use regulation and territorial development. This built upon constitutional rights and the territorial administrative organization, where municipalities were identified as the first-tier division for local governance in 2009.

Recently, spatial planning gained further momentum with expanded legal frameworks for spatial planning instruments, land use regulation, and urban development and building permits. In response to the Timorese Government's call, an **applied research project was initiated to elaborate five Municipal Spatial Plans, incorporating both strategic and regulatory aspects**. Notably, these are **the country's first municipal-level spatial planning instruments**, signifying a crucial step towards initiating spatial planning at this scale. Two plans (Bobonaro and Ermera) have already been formally approved, while the others (Baucau, Lautém, and Viqueque) are still under development.

The approval of these plans is significant as it aligns with the ongoing administrative decentralization process and the gradual implementation of local government autonomy, in accordance with the Constitution.



The territorial development vision for the municipalities rests on **three strategic pillars: compatibility of land uses, preservation of natural resources, promotion of spatial equity and cohesion, and enhancement of territorial vocations and socio-economic development**.

This achievement in spatial planning represents **a milestone in Timor-Leste's progress**, facilitated by a consortium led by NLA-Timor and the Faculty of Architecture of the University of Lisbon, along with the Timorese partner Vanza Belenos, Lda. The project brought together a diverse, international team of experts from various institutions, working in collaboration with local authorities and stakeholders. Overall, the successful elaboration and approval of these municipal plans reinforce Portugal's relationship with Timor-Leste and underscore the country's commitment to sustainable territorial development and local governance.





The primary objective of this project was to establish a comprehensive system of indicators for integration into the Almada Territorial Observatory (OTA) and the CMA's interactive Spatial Planning Status Report (REOTi). The work encompassed several key tasks to facilitate the structuring and organization of OTA and REOTi, as well as the definition, selection, and validation of relevant indicators.

The project involved the following **stages**:

- i) Systematization of Critical Issues in order to provide a foundation for structuring OTA and REOTi, as well as for selecting relevant content and indicators;
- ii) Stabilization of Concepts and Reference Framework, to provide the project with a stable conceptual framework, particularly concerning the objectives and mission of a territorial observatory and the inherent purposes of preparing a municipal REOT;
- iii) Definition of possible scenarios to facilitate the structural arrangement of REOTi, ensuring a robust and adaptable foundation;
- iv) Proposal of a comprehensive structure of indicators for integration into OTA and REOTi, aligning with their respective objectives;
- v) Definition, selection, and validation of indicators for inclusion into the OTA and REOTi. This process involved the establishment of metadata and ensured alignment with applicable legislation and existing concepts;
- vi) Definition of relevant contents to be incorporated into OTA and REOTi, enhancing the richness and depth of the reports; and, finally,
- vii) Systematizations a set of conclusions and recommendations, aimed at guiding the future development and enhancement of OTA and REOTi.

To facilitate this project, the Municipality of Almada provided access to an online platform that serves as the hosting environment for the indicator systems integrated into OTA and REOTi. The establishment of this indicator system is expected to significantly enhance the decision-making processes and territorial planning efforts in the Almada region, benefiting local authorities, stakeholders, and the wider community.




The Municipal Assembly of Santarém, on 19/10/2018, approved a proposal – “Campo Emílio Infante da Câmara – Anticipate the Future” - in order to carry out a **“study that contemplates an integrated solution for Avenida D. Afonso Henriques and Campo Emílio Infante da Câmara”**.

The Program for Campo Emílio Infante da Câmara: Deciding the Future constitutes the implementation of this study which is the subject of a Cooperation Protocol established between the Municipality of Santarém and the Lisbon School of Architecture.

The **first phase** of the PROGRAM – BASIC STUDIES - was dedicated to READING (analysis). In the **second phase** of the PROGRAM, the methodological option of CONSTRUCTION OF SCENARIOS was taken as a tool that best allowed discussing the opening of possibilities and broadening horizons: the temporal and the territorial. This stage of **the PRELIMINARY PROGRAM includes 4 SCENARIOS: CONSOLIDATE, ADAPT, TRANSFORM and ReCONTEXTUALIZE**.

With the discussion, the opening of possibilities (concretized in the presentation to the Municipal Assembly on 11/22/2022) and the comparison of the 4 SCENARIOS, the conditions are met to undertake the path that should be designed in the FINAL VERSION of the PRELIMINARY PROGRAM.



### FRAMEWORK

The **Lisbon Metropolitan Area (AML)**, due to its importance in the national territory, is decisive in the success or failure of the implementation and execution of the **Recovery and Resilience Plan (PRR)**. With regard to housing, the issue assumes even greater relevance, given its importance for the metropolitan area as a whole.

With a view to making its contribution to this aim, AML prepared, in the first half of 2021, an **Action Plan in the field of housing (Action Plan: Housing PRR-AML 2021|2026)**, articulating and coordinating the options of the municipalities that constitute, and which was completed in April 2021.

Thus, still in 2021, after the Action Plan was completed, the decision was made to continue the work developed and to **move forward with this “Diagnosis”**, carrying out an updated and exhaustive survey of households in critical housing conditions that currently persist in the metropolitan territory.



### SCOPE AND OBJECTIVES

This is the **first survey of undignified housing conditions carried out on a metropolitan scale**. In fact, although the National Survey of Housing Relocation Needs was carried out in 2018, coordinated by IHRU, I.P., it only reported on the quantification of households whose existing accommodation was inadequate, not covering a set of other situations of housing indignity, currently recognized as such in legislative documents and integrated in the Diagnosis.

**This work aims to contribute to the knowledge of the housing situation in the 18 municipalities of the AML and to inform the housing policies to be developed by the municipalities**, as a first step towards a joint and integrated reflection that allows us to also begin to reflect on possibilities and response paths on a metropolitan scale, essential for a structural response in this area.

### FOLLOW-UP

Continuing the work carried out in the “Diagnosis”, two other projects have already started in 2023:

- Guide for preparing Municipal Housing Charters;
- Lagos Municipal Housing Charter.

### FRAMEWORK

In the context of the **cooperation established between the Metropolitan Area of Lisbon, the Lisbon School of Architecture, and its Research Center in Architecture**, Urbanism and Design, of the Cooperation Protocol in the Field of Housing, signed between these entities, the July 21, 2023, this project results from an Addendum to this Cooperation Protocol relating to the **development of a “Guide for the Preparation of Municipal Housing Charters” and a “Postgraduate Course on Municipal Housing Charters”**.

### ASSUMPTION

1. The **right to housing** is a constitutional, fundamental and indispensable right for the implementation of a true Social State; However, there is consensus that, in recent years, the housing crisis has worsened in Portugal;
2. In response to this situation, in recent years, a profound remodeling of the legal and regulatory framework was undertaken with a view to the materialization of this right, within which the publication of the **first Basic Housing Law (LBH)** and the creation of a broad set of new public policy programs, and revised public intervention mechanisms in the field of housing;
3. Among the new instruments created, **the Municipal Housing Charter assumes particular importance**, enshrined in the LBH as a “municipal instrument for planning and territorial ordering in matters of housing, to be articulated, within the framework of the Municipal Master Plan (PDM),

with the other instruments territory management and other strategies approved or planned for the municipal territory”;

4. Therefore, it is essential for **AML municipalities** to quickly prepare and approve their Municipal Housing Charters;
5. Taking into account the aforementioned, namely, the need to support municipalities in their task of preparing **Municipal Housing Charters**, the cooperation to be established between AML and FAUL will encompass two distinct but interconnected initiatives, namely: i) the preparation a “**Guide for the Preparation of Municipal Housing Charters**”; and ii) the promotion of a “**Postgraduate Course on Municipal Housing Charters**”, in conjunction with the study to be developed within the scope of the Guide, aiming to create skills for the technical staff of the AML and the municipalities that constitute it.

### METHODOLOGY

The study to be developed will be based on a **methodological approach that will integrate different methods of knowledge production**, including bibliographic review, data collection, document analysis, case studies, survey of good practices, analysis of field experiences, and collection of information through the participation of Lisbon Metropolitan Area (AML) municipalities throughout the process.

## FRAMEWORK

Through a Cooperation Protocol between the Municipality of Lagos, the Lisbon School of Architecture and its Center for Research in Architecture, Urbanism and Design (CIAUD), the proposal for the "**Municipal Housing Charter of Lagos**" was formulated. , in accordance with the provisions of article 22 of the Basic Housing Law (Law no. 83/2019, of September 3), with a view to being submitted for approval by the CML to the Municipal Assembly of Lagos.

## ASSUMPTION

1. The **right to housing is a constitutional, fundamental and indispensable right** for the implementation of a true Social State; However, there is consensus that, in recent years, the housing crisis has worsened in Portugal;
2. 3. 
4. Taking into account the **innovative, highly specialized and exploratory nature of the development of a Municipal Housing Charter**, as well as the need to guarantee a higher level of quality and the highly specialized knowledge that must be underlying, all in a context of speed that allows the maximization of its operational potential, the Lagos City Council is interested in involving FA-ULisboa and its CIAUD research center in its preparation, considering this to be the most appropriate way and which gives greater guarantees of excellence technical and scientific approach to carrying out this task.

## GOALS

In turn, the development of a Municipal Housing Charter allows FA-ULisboa/CIAUD to deepen **the development of applied scientific research in this area of knowledge**, with clear contributions to the advancement of knowledge in this field, which it can later make available to society, through the creation of reports and/or articles to be disseminated in scientific and professional circles and future training and teaching actions in the field.




## The role and impact of informal tools for improving spatial quality in cities across Europe

The research is focused on **the “soft power” approaches of Urban Design Governance (UDG)**, more precisely, in the informal tools of UDG, that refer to those approaches where public authorities act in a semiformal or informal capacity as enablers or brokers rather than through regulatory or investment powers.

The research **hypothesis** is that **the use of informal tools contributes to enlarge the opportunity space for public sector intervention in processes of design governance**, namely by extending the range of means available to public actors to influence how the built environment is shaped, improving the connection among sectoral policy agendas, raising awareness and fostering a placemaking culture.

In this context, the research project will examine the **role and impact of informal tools of UDG** in different European contexts. Through a **comparative analysis of interplay of informal tools used in different case studies against an analytical matrix**, the research will elaborate a set of conclusions and recommendations.



The scope of the study is focused in the huge **peripheral shopping and leisure centers** - which arise in the “in between-cities”, particularly, **throughout the metropolitan territories of Lisbon, Barcelona and London.**

The main purposes are: on the one hand, to ponder the role of such super-places in the creation of new metropolitan corners and in the favoring of the territory’s “wider” use; on the other hand, through the comparison of the three metropolitan areas, to develop some ideas, which may turn to be useful for the drawing up of useful recommendations addressed to the municipal authorities, in a manner that they make a better use of the synergies between these new collective spaces and the places where they are deployed. This way contributing to a more structured development of the contemporary metropolis cooperating in its positive transformation.


**The hypothesis is that these leisure and consumption artifacts could have a strategic impact in the (re) organization of the metropolitan territory**, inasmuch they could create a metropolitan network of synergistic and supportive collective spaces with the network of metropolitan public spaces, thus contributing to, and perhaps enhancing, greater territorial cohesion, notably if they were able to create strong axes of urbanity.


## The City of the Tagus Estuary

*Through the river landscapes: the City of the Tagus Estuary* is a six-years FCT funded research project (post-doctoral research grant), initiated in June 2017, aimed at suggesting a point of view for urban analysis and project that starts from the **Tagus Estuary hydrographic system**, understood as the centre of a wide part of the Lisbon Metropolitan Area.

After **shedding light on the dynamics in progress** (planned interventions, tangible and intangible cultural heritage linked to the water, cultural and spontaneous actions) that contributed to make the estuary the strongest unifying element of the city that set along it, for some years now, the research analyses realised **public regeneration projects facing the estuarine water system** (main riverbed and drainage corridors with superficial or buried water) in order to **understand commonly implemented practices and how the land-water interface is designed**. The focus is on quality factors and components that work together with the visual stimuli of the green/blue scenery. In making an overview of the implemented solutions, the work emphasises the need not only to make use of but also first to perceive the full potential of the proximity to water and the ever-shifting estuarine landscape.



# Intermittent LX. Temporary Uses and Sharing Practices as Support for the Adaptive City. From Experience to Foresight

Worldwide, are emerging several forms of uses of space, activities, expressions, and relationships that enable and empower temporariness and sharing in the urban spaces: it is what we call **Intermittent Practices**. These practices are generating significant changes on the urban context and new challenges to policy, planning, and governance.


Numerous **questions** arise: to which extend the interventions produced by temporary and sharing values are effectively contributing to transform our cities? Are Intermittent Practices (IP) tackling contemporary challenges as the creation of an adaptive city? Are their negative effects being addressed? How can we incorporate the emergence of the temporary and sharing practices in urban processes and public policies?

*Intermittent LX* intends to reflect on these key questions proposing the following **two-fold research object**: **1)** The concepts, rationales and processes that support IP occurring in the Lisbon's Municipality between 2011 and 2021; **2)** The setting of strategies and design tools in which IP act as catalysts and urban resources for activating urban transformations.

Acknowledging a wider scope of the IP, demonstrated by the significant spatial and social urban changes emerged over the past years, *Intermittent LX* systematises a diversified set of IP, subsequently evaluated according to their urban transformative capacity, which will allow the **definition of the design toolbox**.

The project's **temporal framework (2011-2021)** and **spatial focus (Lisbon Municipality)** provide a diverse ground to learn from. It is a period during which Lisbon faced a fast transition from a deep economic recession and social crisis to an economic renaissance and a regeneration-based planning model. During this period, new paradigms of action seem to emerge, through localised proposals and small initiatives, which unlocked the potential of places immediately, rather than in the longer term. All this requires critical assessment for future adjustment, also at the light of the current pandemic crisis, seen as an opportunity to rethink the way we live in cities and design them.

Based on a comprehensive sistematisation of case studies, which lead to operative initiatives (temporary installations, events and activities, networking or information production), **the project explores the hypothesis that Intermittent Practices can catalyse new interventions capable of contribute to transformative actions**, in a more experimental planning approach.



The research project intends to define **[Urban Ethic]** as an innovative design approach to **Social & Affordable Housing & Habitat (S&A-H&H)**, on the path of the **New European Bauhaus (NEB)** culture.

S&A-H&H plays a significant role in the contemporary European Urban Agenda, with great impact on the Portuguese Recovery and Resilience Plan (PRR), which brings urgency to the revision of its design approaches and criteria, avoiding the repetition of outdated models with negative impacts on city and society.



The starting question for this research is which urban and architectural design approaches and criteriae need to be readdressed through the scope of Urban Ethic in order to update S&A-H&H's role and reconciling it with the city. To address this question, the project explores the hypothesis that S&A-H&H design if conceptualized, planned and designed under a scope of Urban Ethic, in order to respond to national and European aims but also attending to new societal challenges and requirements on housing, can contribute to establish new trends and models on urban and architectural policy and design features and criteria. The project starts with **a special focus on urgent and temporary housing**.











## Câmara Municipal de Cascais




